

# FREE - Simple Dishcloth

# Stitch Directory

Ch(s) - Chain(s)

Sc - Single Crochet

3Sc - Do 3 Sc in same stitch

Sl St - Slip Stitch Nxt - Next


# Material Needed

- Crochet Hook 5mm (US H/8)
- Tapestry / Yarn Needle
- 40g Aran /WW 10 Ply (65 yards) 100% Non Mercerised Cotton

## **PATTERN NOTES**

- \* No tension gauge needed.
- \* Finished Dishcloth Size approx. 8" Square.
- \* This pattern is designed for a crochet beginner to practice the Single Crochet stitch (US Terms). (Also known as Dc Double Crochet in UK/AU/NZ terms).
- \* The number in brackets is the stitch count at the end of the row.
- \* Start with a single colour for your 1st dishcloth, before experimenting with two colours.
- \* When working up a two colour dishcloth, do 2 rows of the pattern with colour A, then drop the colour A and pick up colour B to complete the ch1 at the end of the second row, work two rows with colour B, then pick up colour A for the ch1 at the end of the second rows, alternating the colours every two rows. Do not fasten off the yarn on each colour change as it will be hidden by the Sc border worked at the end of the pattern.

## Ch28

Starting in second ch from the hook.

Row 1: Sc in all chs (27 sts), Ch1, turn.

Row 2: Sc in first 2 sts, \*Skip nxt st, 3Sc in nxt st, Skip nxt st, Sc in nxt st \*\* - repeat from \* to \*\* to the last st, Sc in last st (27 sts), Ch1, turn.

Row 3: Sc in all sts (27 sts), Ch1, turn.

Repeat Rows 2 & 3 alternatively for another 26 rows. (Total of 29 rows)

## Border

Top row, work Sc in all sts (26 sts), [Sc, ch2, Sc] in the last st to make a corner, rotate your work and continue to Sc in all rows (27 sts) down the side of your work. [Sc, ch2, Sc] in last st, rotate your work and work along your chain row, Sc in all chs (25 sts), [Sc, ch2, Sc] in last st, rotate your work, along the final side, Sc in all rows (27 sts) (ensure that you crochet over the yarn changes), finishing with a Sc, Ch2 and

SI st into the 1st Sc on the top row. Fasten off yarn and secure all ends.

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Supply List

Needles: US 6 or 7 / 4mm or 4.5mm needles (your choice in size—it doesn't matter) Yarn: Worsted Weight Cotton Yarn. Sample knit with Knitpicks Dishie; 190 yards/100g each skein. You will not need an entire skein for each dishcloth.

Notions: Tapestry Needle for weaving in ends and Scissors.

# Finished Measurement

Approximately 7.5" or 8" square Keep in mind; gauge really doesn't matter with a dishcloth.

# Stitch Glossary

St - Stitch

K - Knit

Sts - Stitches

CO - Cast On

**BO**—Bind Off

# Simple Knitted Dishcloth Instructions


CO 38 sts. Honestly, if you're looking for a bigger or smaller dishcloth/washcloth, cast on any number of stitches.

Row 1: Knit all stitches.

Repeat Row 1 for 8" or desired length.

That's it!!

Super simple, yet looks so beautiful.



# **Finishing**

BO all stitches. Cut yarn, leaving approximately an 8" tail. With your tapestry needle, weave in ends.
